

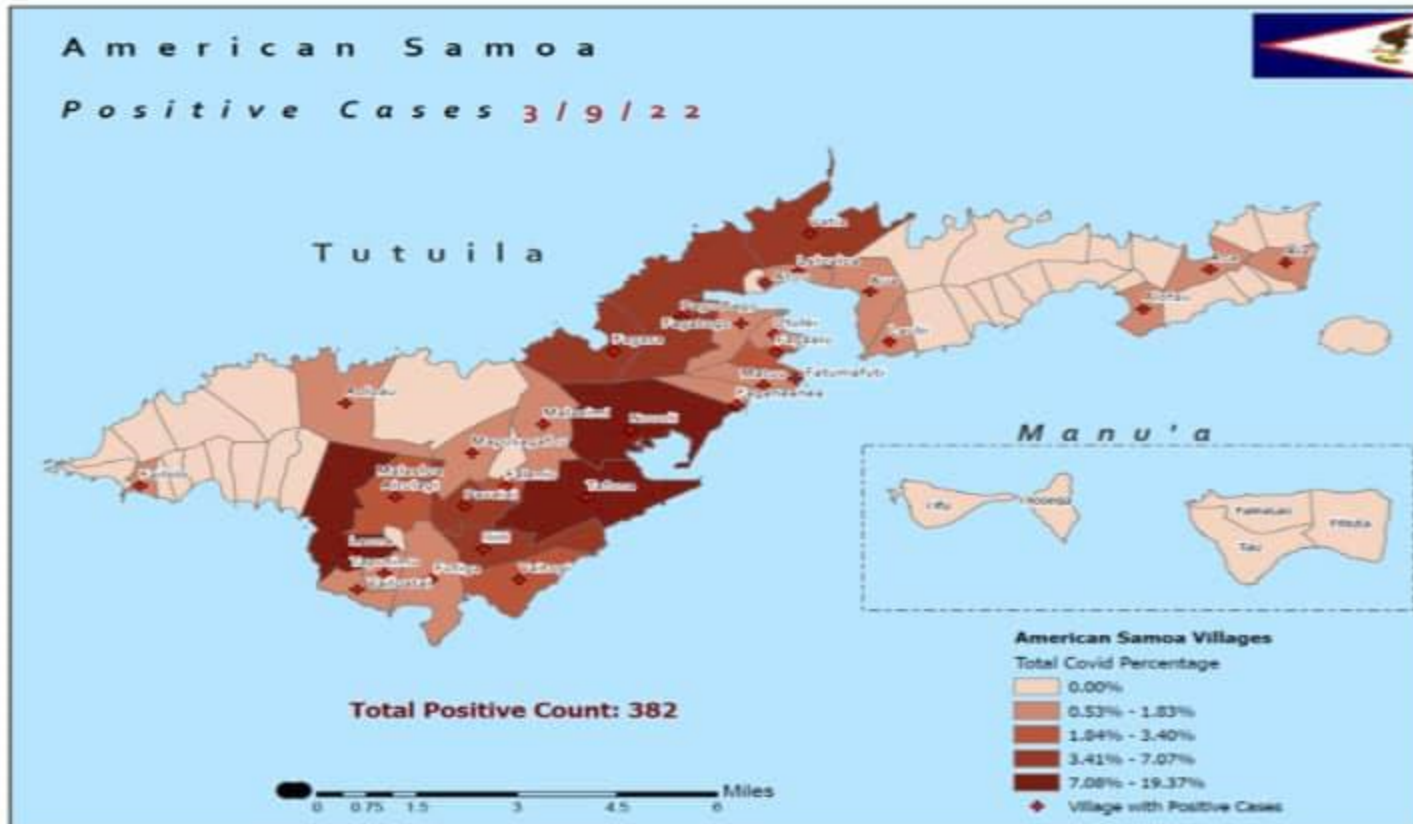

## Situational Summary

On March 09, 2022, about 550 tests were conducted, of these, 39 individuals tested positive. In the past 24 hours, 3 previous positive cases recovered. There are no new hospitalizations that are due to COVID-19. DOH reminds the community that those who test positive are served with a Home Isolation Directive. Anyone with COVID-19 must separate themselves from other people, this may include others in their home.

On Tuesday, March 9, about 821 doses were administered at the COVID-19 Vaccination sites, of these, about 766 doses were boosters. Getting vaccinated prevents severe illness, hospitalizations, and death.

## Upcoming Events

There is a slight change in the schedule for COVID-19 vaccination and testing clinics.

COVID-19 vaccines will be available from 8 AM- 4 PM, through Friday at DYWA in Pago Pago and Tafuna, and Leone Catholic Hall. The Iiili Catholic Hall is now open as a COVID-19 vaccination clinic from 8 AM - 4 PM. **Tafuna DYWA is no longer offering vaccines after 4 PM.** There will also be a COVID-19 Vaccination Drive-Thru on Saturday, March 12 from 8 AM - 2 PM at Tafuna Airport.

COVID-19 tests will be available from 8 AM-4 PM, Tuesday through Friday at the health centers in Amouli, Tafuna, and Leone. **The Tafuna Health Center is no longer providing COVID-19 tests after 4 PM.**
