On April 25, 2024, Governor Lemanu P. S. Mauga and a few U.S. Veterans participated at the Australia & New Zealand Army Corp (ANZAC) parade and dawn service program in Samoa. Attendees included His Highness Tuimaleali'ifano Va'aletoa Sulauvi II, the Honorable Prime Minister Fiame Naomi Mataafa Mulinu'u II, the Royal Samoa Police band, Australian and New Zealander Army Corps members, representatives from the British Government and the Chinese Embassy, New Zealand and Australian law enforcement personnel, as well as leaders, school groups, and members of the community.
