### American Samoa Government Joint Agency Response to a Relief Assistance Request from Aunu'u

On Saturday, September 6, 2025, the American Samoa Government initiated a coordinated emergency response to deliver urgent relief to the residents of Aunu'u, who have been stranded due to recent disruptions in boat services between Aunu'u and Auasi. With vessel operations currently suspended, families in Aunu'u are facing considerable hardship. In recognition of the severity of the

situation, ASG acted swiftly to

ensure the timely delivery of

essential support.

Relief efforts were facilitated through the Aunu'u Liaison in close collaboration with the Department of Search and Rescue, the Office of Homeland Security, the Department of Health, and the Governor's Office.

Beyond immediate assistance, government agencies are actively engaged in strategic planning to develop sustainable solutions that address both the present transportation challenges and the long-term provision of essential services for the Aunu'u community.

The American Samoa Government expresses its profound appreciation and fa'afetai tele lava to all agencies and personnel who have committed their time and resources to this critical effort. Above all, ASG's thoughts and prayers remain with the people of Aunu'u during this difficult time.

Centered around the theme Resilience by Design, this year's summit underscored a strategic, community-led approach to cultivating a safer and more adaptable territory. Spanning three days, the summit featured a robust program aimed at fostering collaboration, innovation, and preparedness. Attendees included representatives from local government agencies, federal entities, regional specialists, and disaster response teams from across the Pacific. The gathering served as a critical forum for sharing best practices, establishing new partnerships, and reaffirming resilience as a foundational design principle.

#### **Groundbreaking Ceremony Marks New LBJ** Warehouse at Lion's Park

On the morning of September 12, 2025, LBJ Tropical Medical Center commemorated a significant milestone with a groundbreaking ceremony for the construction of its inaugural warehouse facility. The event was officiated by LBJ Board Member, Representative Faimealelei A. Allen, and commenced with a spiritual invocation delivered by LBJ Chaplain, Reverend Tumau Petaia.

Lieutenant Governor Pulumataala Ae Ae Jr. addressed attendees on behalf of the government, conveying heartfelt appreciation for LBJ's unwavering service to the people of American Samoa. In his remarks, he lauded the hospital's dedicated staff and recounted a personal experience from a recent visit, underscoring the critical need to advance medical equipment and sustain progress for the future of American Samoa, our children.

LBJ CEO, Dr. Scott Anesi, announced that the new warehouse represents a historic first for the hospital. He commended LBJ's staff for their perseverance and commitment, emphasizing that the project reflects a broader dedication to strengthening healthcare infrastructure throughout American Samoa.

# American Samoa Delegation led by Governor Pulaali'i, attends Historic Swearing-In Ceremony of Samoa's 18th Parliament

A historic milestone was achieved as the Honorable Governor Pulaali'i Nikolao Pula became the first Governor of American Samoa to attend a swearing-in ceremony for the Parliament of Samoa. Accompanying him were First Lady Lois Phillips-Pula and members of the American Samoa Government delegation. Representing the Legislature of American Samoa were Senate President Tuaolo Manaia Fruean and Speaker of the House Savali Talavou Ale.

The official ceremony, held at the Tuana'imato Sports Complex, drew an audience exceeding 2,000 attendees. In an atmosphere marked by solemnity and heartfelt emotion, all 51 members of the 18th Parliament of Samoa were formally sworn in. The occasion also signified a moment of transition, as the outgoing Prime Minister, the Honorable Fiame Naomi Mata'afa, made her final appearance in office. She will, however, continue to serve her constituency as a member of Parliament.

His Highness Tuimaleali'ifano Va'aleto'a Sualauvi II, Head of State of Samoa, administered the oath of office to the nation's 8th Prime Minister, the Honorable La'aulialemalietoa Polata'ivao Schmidt, along with his newly appointed Cabinet.

In his inaugural address, Prime
Minister La'aulialemalietoa extended

Subsequent to the ceremony, Prime Minister La'aulialemalietoa and Governor Pulaali'i convened their first official meeting as leaders of the two Samoas. Their dialogue centered on enhancing bilateral relations and reaffirming their mutual commitment to preserving the enduring ties between the two nations.

Reflecting on the day's importance,
Governor Pulaali'i remarked:
"Today is a great day for the Samoan
Government. Congratulations Prime
Minister La'aulialemalietoa, your
cabinet members, and especially the
people of Samoa."
Governor Pulaali'i's historic
participation in the swearing-in
ceremony of Samoa's Parliament
serves as a powerful testament to the
deep-rooted cultural, ancestral, and
political bonds that continue to unite
the two Samoas.
