

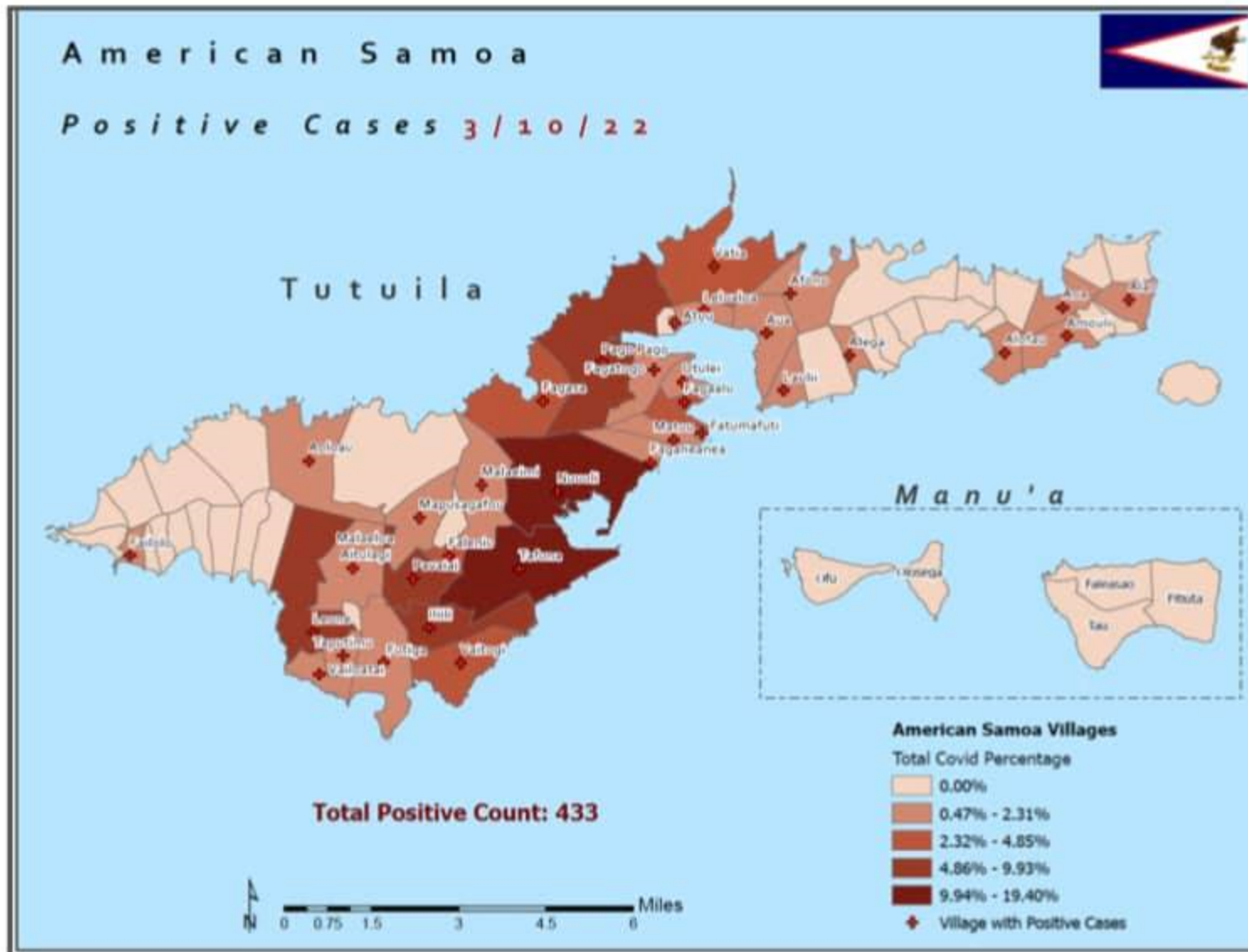

Situational Summary

On March 10, 2022, about 456 tests were conducted, of these, 51 individuals tested positive. In the past 24 hours, 11 previous positive cases recovered; there are no deaths or new hospitalizations due to COVID-19. The cumulative COVID-19 case count is now 433, of which 22 individuals have recovered.

About 974 doses were administered at the COVID-19 Vaccination sites, of these, about 913 doses were boosters. DOH strongly recommends booster doses for the elderly and those who are immunocompromised. COVID-19 vaccines help to prevent severe illness, hospitalizations, and death.

Upcoming Events

Please note the schedule for COVID-19 vaccination and testing clinics.

COVID-19 vaccines will be available from 8 AM- 4 PM, through Friday at DYWA in Pago Pago and Tafuna, and Leone Catholic Hall. The Ilili Catholic Hall is now open as a COVID-19 vaccination clinic from 8 AM - 4 PM. Tafuna DYWA is no longer offering vaccines after 4 PM. There will also be a COVID-19 Vaccination Drive-Thru on Saturday, March 12 from 8 AM - 2 PM at Tafuna Airport.

COVID-19 tests will be available from 8 AM-4 PM, Tuesday through Friday at the health centers in Amouli, Tafuna, and Leone. The Tafuna Health Center is no longer providing COVID-19 tests after 4 PM.
