

American Samoa Department of Education's Close Up Summit: Nurturing Future Leaders through Civic Engagement and Democratic Education



The American Samoa Department of Education hosted a week-long Close Up Summit event dedicated to empowering the youth through discussions on democratic principles and governmental functions. The summit, scheduled from November 6 to November 9, 2023, was held at Governor Η. Rex Lee the Auditorium and gathered a selected group of students from each high school in American Samoa. This event represents the Department of Education's commitment to equipping young individuals with

the essential tools and knowledge required for active participation in the future governance of American Samoa.

Close Up Summit was facilitated by a team including Mia Charity, President of the Close Up Foundation, Anna Bauder, Danny Hastings. The Close Up staff members led engaging workshops and discussions, examining public policy issues influencing the island.

The official opening of the summit

commenced with special remarks from the Lt. Governor, Talauega E.V. Ale. Lt. Governor Ale highlighted the current challenges facing democracy and the urgent need for the younger generation to understand and uphold the principles of a free and just government.

"Democracy is under attack," stated Acting Governor Ale. "There has never been a more crucial time for our youth to immerse themselves in learning the fundamental principles of a free government. Your presence here is not just significant, but critical. You are the future of American Samoa. The responsibility to safeguard our democratic values will soon be in your hands, and it is imperative that you stand firm in upholding the law and the principles of the Government of American Samoa."

Hawaii Job Corps Program Selection from American Samoa

The Office of the Governor in American Samoa announced and offered congratulations to Joshua Sagele, who departed from the territory on Monday, November 27, 2023, to participate in the Hawaii Program. Job Corps This achievement marks a significant milestone as Joshua becomes the Job Corps recipient from American Samoa since the transfer of recruitment responsibilities from the Legislature to the Governor's Office, formalized in August with the signing of the official Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) at the Hawaii Job Corps Campus in Waimanalo, Hawaii.

Over the years, numerous students from American Samoa have successfully enrolled in and completed the Job Corps Program in Hawai'i, while others have pursued the program at centers on the mainland. The Job Corps program was initially introduced in American Samoa around 1997, spearheaded by then House Speaker Nua Saoluaga, Afimutasi Gus appointed who federal Hannemann oversee to government affairs for the House leadership and manage implementation of the Job Corps program in the territory.

The transfer of recruitment responsibilities from the Legislature to the Governor's Office is a pivotal step in streamlining the process, ensuring individuals like Joshua can access the Hawaii Job Corps Program. Governor Lemanu P. S. Mauga also expresses his gratitude









the previous local recruiters, Deeanah Fuimaono and Jeannette Tu'ufuli, for their dedicated years of service in facilitating the recruitment process. Their commitment has laid the groundwork for a seamless transition and continued success in connecting the youth of American Samoa with valuable opportunities.

University of Hawaii-American Samoa Campus Inauguration Marks 45 Years of Education **Partnership**



2023 marked a November 28, momentous occasion as the Honorable Governor Lemanu P. S. presided Mauga over inauguration of the UH-American Samoa Campus facility in the village of Puapua, American Samoa. This event, featuring a ribbon-cutting ceremony and a celebratory dinner, was a culmination of a remarkable 45-year education partnership between the University of Hawaii (UH) and American Samoa.

The roots of this collaboration date back to 1979 when the University of Hawaii was granted the first teacher education contract under a Teacher Corps Program grant. The initial goal was to offer a four-year Bachelor of Education degree, and this partnership was established in collaboration with the American Samoa Community College. The American Samoan Teacher Corps program, operational from 1979 to 1981, evolved into the Territorial **Teacher Training Assistance Project**

(TTTAP), which continued its impact from 1981 to 1997.

From 1997 to the present, the University of Hawaii, in partnership with the American Samoa Community College, has been at the forefront of the Cohort Teacher Education Program. This program has allowed in-service teachers to pursue a high-quality, nationally accredited Bachelor of Education degree while remaining at home with their families. communities, and schools.

During his speech at the ceremony, Lemanu Governor conveyed gratitude for the University of Hawaii's continuous dedication to meeting the teacher education needs of American Samoa. He expressed, "I extend my sincere appreciation to the University of Hawaii for their steadfast support in molding the educational terrain of American Samoa."

This 45-year partnership testament to the shared vision of providing our teachers with the tools they need to thrive. The new UH-American Samoa Campus, marks a significant chapter in American Samoa's educational journey.

Distinguished from the guests University of Hawaii, including UH President David Lassner, Chief Global Vice Provost Brent White. Dr. Ivy Yeung, and PACMED Director Deborah Zuercher, were present. President Lassner acknowledged UH's 40-year Samoa, presence in American emphasizing the profound connection between Hawaii and American Samoa, given the shared challenges faced by their communities.
