SWAINS ISLAND'S CENTENNIAL ANNIVERSARY AND FIRST VOTE IN THE FONO

This is truly a remarkable and momentous milestone! The recognition of Swains Island's 100 year anniversary of becoming part of Tutuila and Manu'a, and the first official vote in the Fono on March 21, 2025 for the Swains Delegate after 65 years. This is a testament to the perseverance and strength of the people of American Samoa and Swains Island. It speaks volumes about the enduring fight for equity, representation, and the principles of democracy that empower self-determination.

On March 4, 1925, Congress passed HJR 294, making Swains Island a part of American Samoa. On May 13,

1925, the United States Navy Raised the U.S. Flag on Swains Island, declaring it a part of American Samoa.
